I'm going to do the traditional things one does on the first day of class for the semester. I'll tell you periods where it will be useful, and, while you can bring it with you whenever you want, I get grumpy when I see students looking at facebook or in chatrooms during class. The same is true of texting. All Cell Phones AWAY, please.

Finally, I'll introduce the week's syllabus for *next* week. You'll normally get one on Thursdays, outlining what I'd like to have you prepare for the week following.
